LOCATION: Ethan Allen Firing Range; Range 4-1 West Bolton, Vermont (*please see map*)

ELIGIBILITY: Open to all competitors, NRA membership not required.

SECURITY: Only those names appearing on the competitor list will be admitted. Any non-competitor that will

accompany you must be named on your match entry worksheet. With the exception of those holding active US military ID; a signed liability release must be provided by all competitors and

non-competitors.

ENTRIES: Limited to 80 individuals per day; <u>advance entries only</u>. No telephone entries. A stand-by list will

be kept. Unclaimed squading will be assigned to stand-by competitors 15 minutes before the scheduled starting time each day. Include signed SR-1 card, signed Liability Release and

worksheet with all match and barracks fees. Entries without fees or otherwise incomplete will not be accepted. Vermont residents have preference for entry in State Championship Matches until May 15th. Non-distinguished entries have preference in the CMP "Leg" match. Include a SASE if

confirmation is required.

RULES: NRA High Power Rifle Rules will govern Matches 1 thru 13.

Civilian Marksmanship Program (CMP) Competition Rules will govern Matches 14 thru 17.

CLASSIFICATIONS: NRA Classification will be used for matches 1-8.

RANGE OPERATION: Competitors will score and pull targets.

AMMUNITION: Any that is safe, furnished by the competitor. A limited supply of ammo is available for Juniors to

use in this tournament. Contact Stephen Lawler before May 15th.

ACCOMODATIONS: There are many motels in the greater Burlington and Essex Junction area. The Vermont

National Guard has authorized the use of barracks for competitors, requested via worksheet. To reserve rooms for women competitors, call Emery Bassett at (802) 878-4733. Competitors are required to sweep out their area on departure. Rooms must be emptied and cleaned prior to shooting on Monday. Showers will be available after the CMP "Leg" match. Camping on the range is authorized; campers must be self contained; no services will be provided.

GENERAL INFORMATION: No Food Service available; pack a lunch and bring rain gear.

SCHEDULE:

- Match 1: Slow fire standing, 200 yards, 2 sighting shots in any position and 20 shots for record in 22
 - minutes, SR Target. Fired on Saturday May 29th at 8:00 AM.
- Match 2: Rapid fire, 200 yards, sitting or kneeling, 2 sighting shots and 2 ten shot strings, 60 seconds per string, SR target. Fired on Saturday, May 29th.
- Rapid fire, 300 yards, prone, 2 sighting shots and 2 ten shots strings, 70 seconds per string, SR-3 Match 3: target. Fired on Saturday, May 29th.
- Slow fire prone 600 yards, 2 sighting shots and 20 shots for record in 22 minutes, MR-1 target. Match 4: Fired on Saturday, May 29th.
- Match 5: **VERMONT STATE POSTAL TEAM.** Aggregate of matches 1 and 2 to establish the 2010 NRA National High Power State Team Postal Match entry from Vermont.
- Rapid fire aggregate of matches 2 and 3. Match 6:
- Slow fire aggregate of matches 1 and 4. Match 7:
- Match 8: **VERMONT HIGH POWER CHAMPIONSHIP**, aggregate of matches 1 through 4.
- Slow fire prone, 600 yards: Unlimited sighting shots and 20 shots for record in 30 minutes, MR-1/ Match 9: MR1-FC targets. Fired on Sunday May 30th at 8:00 AM.
- Slow fire prone, 600 yards: 2 sighting shots and 20 shots for record in 22 minutes, MR-1 / MR1-Match 10: FC targets. Fired on Sunday May 30th.
- Match 11: Slow fire prone, 600 yards: 2 sighting shots and 20 shots for record in 22 minutes, MR-1 / MR1-FC targets. Fired on Sunday May 30th.
- **VERMONT MID-RANGE PRONE CHAMPIONSHIP,** aggregate of 9-11, non-F Class **Match 12:**
- **VERMONT F CLASS CHAMPSIONSHIP**, aggregate of matches 9–11, F Class Match 13: CMP Games Matches. Fired on Sunday, May 31st at 8:00 AM. See Separate Program. Match 14-15:
- CMP Service Rifle EIC "Leg" Match. The 50 Shot National Match Course with ammunition Match 16: furnished by the competitor. Fired on Monday, May 31st at 10:00 AM.
- Match Director's Rifle Match: Non-Service Rifles Only. Fired on Monday May 31st **Match 17:** concurrently with the CMP "Leg" Match (Match 16) over the same course of fire.

AWARDS:

Rotating trophies to the high Vermont resident in Match Rifle and Service Rifle categories. Open winner will receive \$50 cash prize. Individual certificate awards in matches 1-8 as follows:

- * Vermont Service or Match Rifle Champion * High Sub Jr. / Int. Jr. / Jr.
- * Vermont Junior Champion * High Woman * 1st in class for 6 or more in class * High Senior

- Match 12-13: Rotating trophies to the High Vermont resident in Match / Palma Rifle, Service Rifle and "F" Class rifle categories. The open winner in each category with six or more competitors will receive a \$50

cash prize. For the purpose of cash prizes, a rifle category may consist of one, two or three rifles as defined by current NRA High Power Rifle Rules. For a Rifle category consisting of two or three

rifles, each competitor must fire the rifles in the same sequence in Matches 9-11.

- Match 14-15: See Separate Program.
- Match 16: Awards by CMP or the appropriate US Armed Forces Branch where applicable.
- Match 17: Open winner will receive \$50 cash prize if 6 or more entries.
- **RESULTS:** Preliminary Results will be posted periodically on the range throughout the tournament and will

also be posted on the web at www.vsrpa.org after the tournament is complete. Final Results will be posted on the web site and e-mailed (if an e-mail is provided on the Worksheet). All non-trophy awards will be mailed to each competitor. Look for the NRA 2010 National State Team Postal Match Results in the April or May 2011 Issue of Shooting Sports USA Magazine. Entry materials for the 2011 Matches will be made available for download at www.vsrpa.org during the last week

of March 2011.

ELIGIBILITY: Open to all competitors who may legally handle a firearm

SECURITY: Only those names appearing on the competitor list will be admitted. Any non-competitor that will

accompany you must be named on your match entry worksheet. A signed liability release must be

provided by all competitors and non-competitors.

ENTRIES: Limited by range capacity to 20 total competitors for each available match. No telephone entries.

A stand-by list will be kept. Unclaimed squading will be assigned to stand-by competitors 15 minutes before the start of each match. Include signed Liability Release and worksheet, and all match and optional barracks fees. Entries without fees or otherwise incomplete will not be

RULES: CMP Rules apply. Only "as-issued" rifles in the correct original caliber may compete, and must

have as-issued iron sights, as-issued wood stocks and standard service rifle trigger pull. 55 total rounds maximum per match (5 sighters, 20 shots slow-fire prone, 10 shots standing to prone, 10 shots standing to sitting or kneeling, 10 shots slow fire standing). *No Alibis will be allowed*.

RANGE OPERATION: Competitors will score and pull targets on alternate relays, all scoring done in the pits.

AMMUNITION: Any that is safe, furnished by the competitor.

ACCOMODATIONS: There are many motels in the greater Burlington and Essex Junction area. The Vermont

National Guard has authorized the use of barracks for competitors, requested via worksheet. To reserve rooms for women competitors, call Emery Bassett at (802) 878-4733. Competitors are required to sweep out their area on departure. Camping at the range facility is authorized; campers

must be self contained; no services / hook-ups will be provided.

GENERAL INFORMATION: No Food Service available; pack a lunch and bring rain gear.

SCHEDULE:

Match 14: CMP John C Garand Match:

Course of fire will be according to CMP John C Garand Match Course B, all at 200 yards. Rifle must be a Caliber .30 U.S. M1 Garand that was issued by the U.S. Armed Forces, be in as issued condition, and otherwise comply with Rule 6.3.2. M1 Carbine may be used instead of a Garand. Assembly is at 7AM with first shots down range at 8AM.

Assembly is at 7AW with first shots down range at 6AW.

Match 15: CMP Springfield / Vintage Military Bolt Gun Match:

Course of fire will be according to CMP John C Garand Match Course B, all at 200 yards. Asissued U.S. Springfield Model 1903 or 1903A Springfield series rifle that complies with rule 6.2.4, or as-issued U.S. Model 1917 or Krag rifle that complies with Rule 6.2.4, or manually operated, asissued foreign military rifle that complies with Rule 6.2.5 may be used.

Assembly is 11AM with first shots down range as Noon.

AWARDS:

Match 14: John C Garand "Blanket Match". Each participant in this match can optionally bring a shooting-

related item costing approximately \$20, with all items being placed on a blanket. Highest score of shooters participating in blanket match will have 1st pick, 2nd highest will have 2nd pick and so on.

Match 14-15: CMP awards (Gold, Silver and Bronze) will be awarded based on qualifying scores. Highest score

in each respective match will receive a trophy plaque.

RESULTS: Final results will be posted on the web at www.vsrpa.org after the tournament is complete, with

results also being e-mailed to all participants who provide an e-mail address on the worksheet.



Directions to Ethan Allen Firing Range (EAFR)



Entry to EAFR:

- 1) Proceed to Ethan Allen Rd.
- 2) Proceed .7 miles on Ethan Allen Road to reach the EAFR Gate House. This Gate House may or may not have a guard present. If not, proceed. If so stop, identify yourself and state your purpose (VSRPA shooting activity on range x). You may have to show valid ID (Driver's License Acceptable) to gain entry. PLEASE OBEY 25 MPH SPEED LIMIT.

To Ranges 3-2 and 4-1

- 3) Proceed .5 miles past the EAFR Gate House and then take a Right Turn. You will have just passed Range Control (Red House) on your left; you do not need to stop at Range Control if you are attending a scheduled match or practice.
- 4) Range 3-2 will be on your left approximately .5 miles from the Right Turn, stay on main road.
- 5) Range 4-1 will be ahead of you approximately 2.8 miles from the Right Turn; just keep following the main road.
- 6) The **Barracks** (available for overnight use) are .2 miles on your right just past the Right Turn.

To Ranges 5-1 and 5-2

- 3) Proceed .3 miles past EAFR Gate House and then make a **Left Turn**. You will be on a paved road that passes large warehouse buildings on your right, and a vehicle maintenance compound on your left. The road will turn to dirt and will curve around an up a hill to your right; stay on main road.
- 4) Ranges 5-1 and 5-2 will be approximately .5 miles on your left from the Left Turn.
